

The Sikshanamandira is situated in the midst of a peaceful and beautiful campus in the proximity of the sacred precincts of Belur Math, Howrah, West Bengal. The site is at a distance of about one furlong to the west of the river Ganga and about two furlongs to the east of the Grand Trunk Road, which is linked to the Howrah Station and the Dunlop Bridge by regular bus service. It is easily accessible by two local rail stations (Belur Math & Belur stations) and by the regular ferry service on the Hooghly River.

The College: at a Glance

Established in 1958 by Srimat Swami Vimuktananda (one of the architects for actualizing the educational vision as was envisaged by Swami Vivekananda), as a Residential Teachers' Training College for male students sponsored by the Govt, of West Bengal and affiliated to the University of Calcutta.

Recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014 the present intake capacity for the B.Ed. course is 100 for a year) in the year 2002-03.

Declared as a College of Teacher Education (CTE) by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India in the year 2001.

Accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2007 with 'A' grade.

Upgraded into a post graduate College by the NCTE (as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014 the present intake capacity for the M.Ed. course is 50 for a year) in the year 2008.

On the recommendations of the University Grants Commission, the University of Calcutta conferred the status of an Autonomous College in favour of this institution in 2008.

M.Phil. Programme in Education was initiated in the year 2012-13.

Post-graduation Diploma in Guidance and Counselling Course started in the year 2013.

Recognized as a Study Centre of Netaji Subhas Open University for conducting ODL B.Ed. (with 200 students) in 2013.

Recognized as a Study Centre of West Bengal Board of Primary Education for conducting ODL D.EI.Ed. (with 100 students) in 2013.

Initiated Swami Vivekananda Centre for Multidisciplinary Research in Educational Studies (SVCMRES) a Research Wing under the University of Calcutta in 2014.

Re-Accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2015 with an 'A' grade.

Started Post-graduation Diploma in Yoga Education and Certificate Course in Communicative English and Writing on 2016.

Awarded the status of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by the UGC on 2016.



At Sikshanamandira, we expect our students to dive into academic life, get to know their professors, and pursue interests both inside and outside of the classroom. The curriculum is structured, but you will have the chance to be creative, as well. Throughout your experience, you will develop meaningful relationships with your advisers and mentors. From entry to exit year, you will have different kinds of advisers: academic concentration advisers (members of the faculty or staff), residential advisers (graduate students or administrators), and peer advisers, barrier free augmented inclusivity, all available to guide and help you.

The research opportunities at Sikshanamandira are virtually endless. Our faculty values the opportunity to work with undergraduates, and beginning freshman year, you can pursue research as part of your normal academic programmme.

One thing should be especially remembered here, that there is no connection between these historical researches and our real aim, which is the knowledge that leads to the acquirement of Dharma. Even if the historicity of the whole thing is proved to be absolutely false today, it will not in the least be any loss to us. Then what is the use of so much historical research, you may ask. It has its use, because we have to get at the truth; it will not do for us to remain bound by wrong ideas born of ignorance.

At the present time the externals, the physicists, have become supreme, and they have put down many claims of psychologists and metaphysicians. So far as my knowledge goes, I find that the real, essential parts of psychology are in perfect accord with the essential parts of modern physical knowledge. It is not given to one individual to be great in every respect; it is not given to one race or nation to be equally strong in the research of all fields of knowledge. The modern European nations are very strong in their research of external physical knowledge, but they are not so strong in their study of the inner nature of man. On the other hand, the Orientals have not been very strong in their researches of the external physical world, but very strong in their researches of the internal. Therefore we find that Oriental physics and other sciences are not in accordance with Occidental Sciences; nor is Occidental psychology in harmony with Oriental psychology. The Oriental physicists have been routed by Occidental scientists. At the same time, each claims to rest on truth; and as we stated before, real truth in any field of knowledge will not contradict itself; the truths internal are in harmony with the truths external.

The College offers a **Bachelor of Education** (**B.Ed.**) course, syllabus of which was framed by the Board of Studies and the Academic Council of the College in 2008 and was revised in 2013 & 2015. The strength in this course is 100. The duration of the programme is 2 year/ 4 Semesters.

Eligibility Criteria for Admission:

Candidates (Male only) with at least 50% marks in Bachelor's Degree / Master's Degree or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible to apply for admission to the Programme. There shall be relaxation of marks for candidates belonging to reserved categories and physically challenged categories as per the Rules of the Government of West Bengal.

Admission Policy and Process:

The College adheres strictly to the norms framed by the NCTE regarding admission. Approved graduate teachers, deputed by recognized secondary schools of West Bengal (Class IX & X) and the D.I. of Schools of the district concerned, are eligible for admission. Non-teacher graduates are also eligible, if they are below 35 years of age. A list of candidates selected for interview as per academic scores will be put on the College Notice Board and the web-site of the College. Selected applicants will be asked to appear in an interview thereafter. Final List is prepared after the interview.







M.Ed.

The College offers a *Master of Education* (*M.Ed.*) course, syllabus of which was framed by the Board of Studies and the Academic Council of the College in 2008 and was revised in 2013 & 2015. The strength in this course is 50. The duration of the programme is 2 year/4 Semesters.

Eligibility Criteria for Admission:

Candidates seeking admission to the M. Ed. Programme should have obtained at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade in the following programmes:

B.Ed.

B.A. B.Ed., B.Sc. B.Ed.

B. El. Ed.

D. El. Ed. With graduation degree (with 50% marks in each)

Admission Policy and Process:

The College adheres strictly to the norms given by the NCTE regarding admission. A list of candidates selected for interview as per academic scores will be put on the College Notice Board and the web-site of the College. Selected applicants will be asked to appear in an interview thereafter. Final List is prepared after the interview.





M.Phil.

The College offers *M.Phil* programme in Education. The strength in this course is 14. The duration of the programme is 2 year/4 Semesters.

Eligibility Criteria for Admission:

Eligibility for appearing in Written Admission Test = 55% Marks in M.A. in Education/ M.Ed. from a UGC recognized University/ Institution (Number relaxation for reserve category as per State Government Rules). Candidates having NET/SET/SLET are exempted from written test but are to appear at the interview.

Admission Policy and Process:

The applicants will have to appear in written admission test comprising of 100 marks (Both objective and essay type questions) and interview. Final selection will be based on the basis of consolidated performance of the appeared candidates (academic score, written test and interview).

This research centre would serve as a research wing of the College. The aforesaid Research Centre is duly recognized by the University of Calcutta.)

Eligibility Criteria for Admission:

Candidates (Male only) with at least 55% marks in M.A. in Education / 55% marks in M.Ed. are eligible to apply for admission to the programme. There shall be relaxation of marks for candidates belonging to SC/ST categories as per the Rules of the Government of West Bengal. Candidates having NET/SET/SLET/M.Phil (according to UGC Regulation 2009) are exempted from written test but are to appear at the interview.

Admission Policy and Process:

The applicants will have to appear in written admission test comprising of 150 marks (both objective and essay type questions) and interview. Final selection will be based on the basis of consolidated performance of the appeared candidates (academic score, written test and interview).

Eligibility Criteria for Admission:




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
